Well-being and ADHD.

What is research? Why is this project being done?

Research is a way we try to find out the answers to questions. We want to try and find out how you are feeling and what things are like for you.

Why have I been asked to take part?

We are asking lots of children and teenagers who come to the ADHD clinic and their brothers and sisters to take part.

What will happen if I take part?

You, and any of your brothers or sisters aged 6 to 18, will be asked to answer some questions for me or your parent(s). If you like you can fill them in yourself.

Will you tell anyone what I say?

Only the researchers will know what you say. No one else will be told unless we think it could help you, then we may tell someone, like your usual doctor.

Who else will you tell that I am doing the study?

If you agree, we will tell your usual doctor and your teacher that you are taking part in this research.

Is it a test?

No. There are no right or wrong answers. We just want to know what you think.

How long will they take?

About 5 to 10 minutes.

Do I have to take part?

No, you don't have to. It is up to you and no one will be annoyed.

What if I change my mind or want to stop?

You can stop at any time, we won't mind.

What if there is a problem?

If you feel worried or upset about anything at all, let us or your parents know and we will try to answer your questions and help you.
