We are undertaking research into the Matilda programme.

The Matilda project is about supporting older adults with learning disabilities to join a local community group.


Such as Men's shed, knitting group, a bowling group, a sports group, etc.

Research is a way of finding things out. What works well, and what needs to be improved.

This information sheet tells you about the project.

This will help you decide if you want to take part in the project or not.

We will ask 2-3 people from the local community group, to support you to access the group for six months.



In order to test if the Matilda project works, we need to put some people in the 'Matilda programme' and some on another group called the 'control group'.

This will be done like a draw and will be random.



If you are picked to take part in the Matilda programme, a member of the Trust staff will talk to you and your carers about what things you are interested in.

A Volunteer Co-ordinator will help to find you a local community group, and also 2-3 volunteers from that group, who will support you to go to the group for approximately six-months.



Those allocated to the control group, will get their normal day to day activities and will be offered 3 recreational activities with their peers over the course of the 6-month study (cinema, bowling, meal, etc).

The Trust staff will organise these three events. Please note you will not be offered the Matilda programme.



Both groups will complete some surveys about your health and behaviours.

We will ask you to complete the same survey at three different times.

Someone can help you to complete these surveys.



As a thank-you for completing the survey, we will give you a £10 youcher each time.




We would also like to talk to you with other people with learning disabilities about how you are getting on in the Matilda group.

This is called a focus group.

There will be between 4-6 people in the group.

We will hold the focus group in a place near you.
