Plain English summary of protocol

Background and study aims

This study is conducted to find out if the four-week summer workshop delivered by the Discover Childrens Story Centre, helps to improve pupils writing skills during the transition from Year 6 to Year 7, especially the pupils with poor to average writing skills (between Key Stage 2 Level 3c and Level 4c). This will include a variety of workshops, including poetry and literacy sessions combined with a range of enrichment activities such as trips to performances and sporting activities.

Who can participate?

Pupils in Year 6 (2012/13 academic year), whose KS2 English is predicted to be between Level 3c and Level 4c and attending primary and secondary schools that are willing to agree to all research procedures can participate in this study.

What does the study involve?

In total, 250 pupils will take part in this study. They will be randomly allocated to one of two groups: receiving workshop in the summer holidays of 2013 or a school-based reading and writing workshop (control group). At the beginning of the autumn term 2013, all participating Year 7 pupils will complete the GL Assessment Progress in English (PiE) 11 (Long Form). Pupils in the control group will be offered the school-based workshop after this evaluation. The results of pupils who have taken part in the four-week summer workshop will then be compared with the results of pupils in the control group, in order to find out the effect the workshop has had on pupils writing skills.

What are the possible benefits and risks of participating?

Participating pupils will have the opportunity to be selected to attend the summer school, free of charge, which will provide interesting and memorable experiences and may improve their reading and writing skills. There are no known risks of participation.

Where is the study run from?

The independent evaluation is being conducted by the University of York and Durham

University. The Discover Childrens Story Centre is responsible for communication with schools and conducting the workshop.

When is the study starting and how long is it expected to run for?
The study begins in January 2013 and is expected to last for one year.

1. Secondary schools will be eligible to participate if they are willing to liaise with feeder primary schools to identify eligible pupils that will attend in Year 7 and if they are willing to undertake all related research procedures.
2. Primary schools will be eligible if they are willing to undertake all related research procedures and are identified as feeder schools to the participating secondary schools.
3. Eligible pupils will include:
 - 3.1. Those in participating schools
 - 3.2. Year 6 pupils in the 2012/13 school academic year
 - 3.3. Those predicted to achieve between Level 3c and Level 4c in KS2 English, based on the teacher assessments
