Background and study aims

Therefore, the goal of the study is to conduct an extensive study to get a detailed picture of discrimination in the field of medicine to serve as a first basis to make medicine more inclusive.

What does the study involve?

The study involves completing a questionnaire investigating experienced discrimination in medical school and working as a doctor.

By answering the questions in this study participants can help to document experiences of discrimination in medical school and working as a doctor.
